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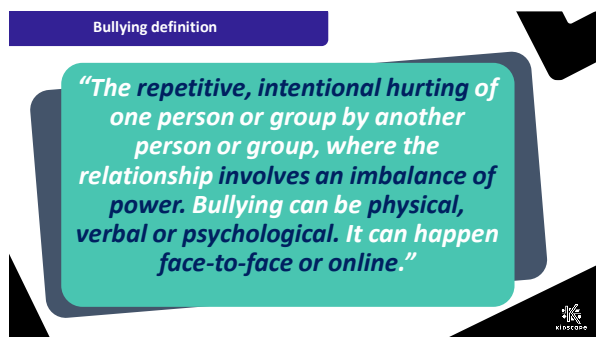
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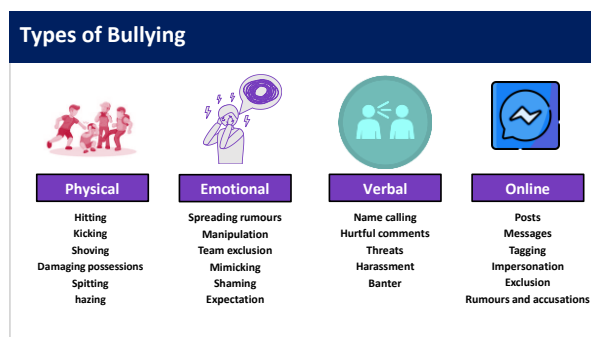

- Keep everything in writing.
- Ask for school records.
- Prepare for meetings.
- Agree timescales.

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Communication with your child's school

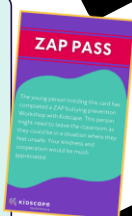
- Have a designated 'safe' person who the child chooses and whom they have a good rapport with ie. a TA, a pastoral team member.
- Have a 'safe' place to go to ie. the office of someone they trust.
- Have a special card or signal they can use to show to a teacher if they need to leave the classroom unquestioned with a plan in place as to where they should go.



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Communication with your child's school

- Pastoral work to support self-esteem.
- Discuss particular times of day/places/situations where the bullying occurs and put in a detailed plan as to how to manage these situations.
- Ensure all staff are aware and know how to manage the situation. This should include playground supervisors.
- Whole class/year group/school anti-bullying sessions.
